Baker in Washington

Oscar M. Alexy, a baker who made pastries that were sold in restaurants and stores in the Washington area, died Saturday at Cafritz Memorial Hospital after a heart attack. He was 85.

Mr. Alexy was born in what is now Czechosłovakia. He learned baking in Budapest. In the 1920s, he immigrated to the United States, settling first in New York City, where he worked as a baker for Longchamps Restaurant.

He moved here in 1945 and opened his own bakery, Cake-Masters, at 4015 South Capitol St. His shop sold to retail and wholesale establishment in the area. He continued to run the bakery until becoming ill two months ago.
