ARTHUR BARDOS

Arthur Bardos, a Hungarian theater director who worked for the Voice of America here from 1949 to 1959, died Aug. 10 in Buffalo. He was 92 years old and lived in Snyder, N. Y.

In 1910, Mr. Bardos founded the New Stage, an experimental theater in Budapest. Six years later, he founded the Inner City Theater, which he headed until he came to the United States in 1948 as a visiting professor of drama at Catholic University in Washington.

Surviving are his widow, Vilma; two sons, Dr. Thomas J. Bardos and Arthur Bardos Jr., and two grandchildren.
