I tried to reach you this morning on Number GE 5509 but unfortunately I did not get an answer. Probably nobody was at home.

As I have to spend a week at Washington I would be very glad to see you—just to have a chat.

May I ask you to give me ring at any day between 9 and 10 o'clock in the morning or in the afternoon about six o'clock in order to fix an appointment.

As Mrs. Bekessy is not in a perfectly good health condition and he does not go out in the evening we both would be very glad to have you and Mrs. Vasvari one evening either to dinner or after dinner. We are staying at the house of my son who just today went into the Army.

and in desperation he tried to kill himself
