Dr. Domjan Dies; Once Led Revolt

Dr. Frank Domjan, who came here as a veterinarian after being a leader of the anti-Soviet uprising in Hungary in 1956, died last night at Incarnate Word Hospital. He was 59 years old.

Dr. Domjan, who suffered a stroke Saturday night, was in charge of the provisional government in the western Hungarian region around Szentgotthard during the Oct. 23-Nov. 4 uprising.

He fled to Austria and then to the United States with his wife and five children when Soviet troops crushed the revolt. He held two degrees from the Budapest University School of Veterinary Medicine.

He lived at 250 Kenore Court, Webster Groves and was employed by the Federal Government as a veterinarian.

Surviving besides his wife, Violet, are a daughter, Mrs. Erika Wisler, Washington, and three sons, Frank Jr. and Gabe, students at the University of Missouri at St. Louis, and Laszlo, a reporter for the St. Louis Bureau of United Press International.
