Döhmel came to H. 1923 with
a letter of Hitler to the "Awak.
Magars," who received the letter
with great joy. Döhmel says that
the A. M. P. had the following
revol. program, to be
carried out under the leadership
of Dr. Kemere:

- 1.) Restoration of 1914 boundaries
- 2.) overthrow of Bethlen Govt
- 3.) bloody annihilation of
Jews. (Blutige Vernichtung
der Juden Ungarns.)

this last purpose Eckhardt sent

President Edward Benes of Czecho-
Slovakia planned to take these
documents to the League of

[In 1920, ~~was~~ These activities
were motivated by the forced
acceptance of the Treaty of Trianon
June 4, 1920. The revolutionary
propaganda was aimed at bringing
about the collapse of the new
socialist govts in Germany, Austria
and the disrupting of the newly
created Czechoslovakia, and regaining
the territory given by the Trianon
Treaty to the successor states.
To prove that Eckhardt had connections
with the nationalistic circles outside
of Hungary see his own speech
in Hungarian parliament held after
~~Dec 1~~ the Munich treaty Dec. 1-1923
