Similar to having found "The Solution of the Hamlet Problem" (University Press Budapest and Sorbonne in Paris) Dr. Erdos finds **THE SOLUTION TO THE RELIGIOUS PROBLEM PERTAINING TO OUR DAILY LIVES** in distinguishing between "peripheral, central and focal man." (Carnegie Hall lecture on 4/13/73) The peripheral man is getting stuck on the surface of things, in forms, principles and ideas, without being able to penetrate anyone of life's most essential values; the central man is capable of getting to the core of things, but he is getting stuck in one or two important goals, without being able to get hold of all the minimal number of most important individual, National and Universal (INU) values. Such combinations of striving after the most indispensable good and small, idealistic and materialistic, etc. pose the great strength of the focal man. One can be most "just, moral, ambitious" etc. yet never be "chosen" if he is either "peripheral" or "central." Only a "focal man" can resolve.
