Msgr. EÖRDÖGH ELEMER

67 years old in 1942. Priest of the Archdiocese of Kalocsa, Hungary, held pastorates in Bácsuffalu and Ófuttak, the latter in the southernmost part of the country. Ófuttak was considered one of the best parishes in Hungary, the landowner Count Rudolph Chotek, brother of wife of Crown Prince Franz Ferdinand.

According to reliable information he had to leave the country to escape a great scandal (homosexuality)

In U. S. he came to Toledo about 1911, which became one of the largest parishes of Hungarian Cath. Considered leader of the older H. cath.

priests, and leader of the so-called "legitimists", party working for the restoration of the Hapsburgs. Always had connections with the family of the deposed and deceased King, visited them in Lequeitio, Spain, presenting portable typewriters, etc. to the children. Very ambitious man, who was certain to become a bishop in H, still entertains similar hopes, to be realized in H. Very strong revisionist, handsome, always smiling, but ruthless man.
