

"Esterhazy" Sask., Canada

Village about 24 miles from the Manitoba border, on the C.P.R. line N (Canadian Pacific Railway) of the Au-Appelle Valley. Named after Count Esterhazy, Hungarian nobleman who settled some of his countrymen in the district. Incorporated in 1903, the village serves a large mixed-farming area and has a flour mill. There are summer resorts at Round Lake, about 20 miles south. Esterhazy has a hospital and a weekly newspaper, "Observer."
