Julian W. Andrzejowski, Secretary of the "Polish Committee" in San Francisco, Calif., in a letter of May 31, 1864, addressed to the Editor of the "Echo z Polski" a Polish /the first/ newspaper published in New York City writes as follows:

" Dr. L. J. Czäpkay, an honored member of the "Polish Committee" is planning shortly to depart from this section -- and sail for Europe, where he will seek rest from his medical occupation after practicing constantly for ten years /came to San Francisco in 1854/ in this city. Dr. L. J. Czapkay is a Hungarian by birth, and was one of the first members of the "Polish Committee" and later of the "Polish Society", he was one of the most active, spending a great deal of time and money for the Polish cause --- also he used all his influence, to convince the American citizens of the historical rights and demands of the Polish Nation ----- he participated the most in collecting material aid for Poland. He is an honor to his people --- he was unanimously elected Vice-President of the "Society", and cheerfully fulfilled his duties, through his unceasing efforts to bring enthusiasm and harmony in the "Society", he won the hearts of all the Patriots and fulfilled the historical friendship between Hungary and Poland"
