Emspak Fined, Given Six Months for Contempt

tary-treasurer of the United Elec- Party due. trical, Radio and Machine Workers of America, was sentenced in District Court yesterday to serve six months in jail and pay a \$500 fine for contempt of Congress.

Sentence was imposed by Judge F. Dickinson Letts, before whom Emspak was tried without a jury. Judge Letts found Emspak guilty Monday of 68 charges of contempt of Congress for failing to answer questions before a one-man subcommittee of the House Committee on Un-American Activities on December 5, 1949 Judge Letts denied bail, pending appeal.

Although Emspak was tound guilty on the 68 charges, the whole thing is regarded as one transaction and the maximum possible sentence that Emspak could have gotten would have been one year and a \$1,000 fine.
