P. 155. :. One of the most brilliant  
workers in Hungary's cause is Dr.  
Tibor E., who has long played a  
prominent part in the political  
life of his country, being one of  
the founders of the National  
Government which restored order  
after the expulsion of Bela Kun.  
Dr. E.'s outstanding ability has  
made a lasting impression upon  
members of the British House  
of Commons when he was been  
invited to address them in a  
committee room at Westminster.  
During the few years that he has  
been my friend, I have often  
had occasion to admire his  
rare qualities of political  
foresightedness. Looking  
much younger than his actual  
age of fifty one, and still

a keen fencer and polo player,  
this ardent and dynamic  
statesman became the leader  
of the Small Farmers' Party, and  
succeeded Count Albert  
Apponyi as chief delegate of  
Hungary to the League of  
Nations in 1934. He is a man  
whose high intellectual  
attainments and strength of  
character would make him  
a commanding figure in  
the political life of any  
country.
