

Hungary Studies 'Capital' in U. S.

**Anti-Nazi Group
Favors Pittsburgh**

NEW YORK, Dec. 27 (N. Y. News).—Smoky Pittsburgh may soon be brightened by the panoply of a Hungarian government in exile, replete with prime minister and cabinet, it was revealed today. Its transition to an international capital may result from the transatlantic dash to United States of Tibor Eckhardt, who is now on his way here as a special emissary of Admiral Nicholas Horthy, Hungarian regent.

Eckhardt, a violent anti-Nazi, is on his way to this country in a breathless game of international cat-and-mouse by which Horthy hopes to offset some of the consequences of being forced to sign with the Axis powers last month.

Eckhardt has been assigned to offset Nazi pressure to place as Hungarian minister in Washington, Count Ferenc Hunyadi, 39-year-old friend of Hitler.
