ECKHARDT TO SPEAK HERE

Hungarian Agrarian Leader on Way to U. S. for Lecture Tour

BUDAPEST, Hungary, April 4—Tibor Eckhardt, former Hungarian chief delegate to the League of Nations and leader of the small Land-owners' party, left yesterday for Genoa, Italy, whence he is to sail to the United States to deliver a series of lectures. He called his visit an informative one.

He is convinced that the United States will have a vital part to play after the war in the reconstruction of Europe.

He emphasized that he was not charged by any one to speak on behalf of any particular party and that, being under no obligation, he would feel free to speak according to his own conscience.
