## Akron Leaders Want Plans for Future Discussed

Henry Wrisfield, secretary and Frank Lajtor treasurer, said that the free Hungary movement, y movement file tinning favor in the hearts all tingentians here, has failed fav to argue any interest toward joining the group "Eckhardt, although given oppor-tunity to express himself freely in the Hungarian press here, has not told us what kind of a free Hun-gary he desires" the statement went on

"Is his kind of a Hungary one hat will keep the peasant land-se? Is it the kind that will keep that less? n force the present labor restric-ions? Will it keep in force the Anti-semilic laws forced upon that unhappy country? Will it help to keep in power the forces that helped Hungary to become an un-willing food arsenal for Hitler? These and other questions we would like to have answered.

"Dr. Vambery, who met with the Hungarian Democrats in Cleveland two weeks ago, has also announced a plan for the organization of American Hungarians for the pur-pose of advocating a free Hungary," the statement continued.

"We are loyal American citizens who want to help unfortunates in or from the land of our birth but we feel that this can best be done by supporting a free and democratic Hungary.

"With this in mind, we urge the leaders of both groups to meet on one platform here so that the 15,000 Hungarian people of Akron can hear discussed the problems of how best to bring about a united action for help for Hungary."
