One of the Deputies in the Hungarian Parl. made an interpellation about Eckhardt (presumably after the publication of his manifesto in U.S.): How is it possible that Eckhardt secured foreign currency in Hungary for his trip to America?

Premier Bárdossy replied that, although this happened under the Teleki Government, his government assumes full responsibility for it. The Hungarian Premier certainly could not have supposed or imagined that a member of the Parliament of Hungary will use this money against the interests of his own country.
