Hungary Group Fights Hitler, Committee Says

Denies Rumors of Plan to Put Magyars Over Slovak People

Objective of the Movement for Independent Hungary is the organizing of Hungarians throughout the world to fight Hitler and gain an undominated homeland, the movement's executive committee declared yesterday.

The committee said rumors have been circulated among American citizens of Slovak descent to the effect that the Movement for Independent Hungary seeks to re-establish Magyar domination over the Slovak people.

"We solemnly declare once more," the statement issued from headquarters at 400 East 57th street said, "that we recognize without reservation the rights of all peoples to self-termination."

The committee decried "the surrendering of the Hungarian government to Hitler's military intervention—contrary to the will of the Hungarian nation—and its participation on Germany's side in the attack on Yugoslavia." It asked that satisfaction be given Yugoslavia after the war.

With regard to Czechoslovakia, the statement declared that both that nation and Hungary have accepted the Atlantic Charter as the basis of a future peace and that by its application all antagonisms of the past must be eliminated.

Referring to Rumania, the statement declared it was "most unfortunate" that the question of Transylvania had been permitted to create a conflict between that nation and Hungary.
