## Composer Dohnányi

NEW YORK, Feb. 10 (UPI) — Ernest von Dohnányi, 82, Hungarian-born composer and pianist and professor of music at Florida State University, died here of a heart failure following an attack of influenza.

Dr. Elmer John Wahl, his physician and long-time friend, said von Dohnányi had "worn himself out" in recent recording sessions.

Mr. Von Dohnányi, composer of symphonies, operas, chamber music and piano works, came to the United States from Hungary in 1949.

## Ernst Dohnanyi, Pianist, Composer

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Feb. 10 (AP). — Ernst Dohnanyi, 82, pianist, composer and conductor, died last night in New York after a heart attack that accompanied influenza.

He had been a member of the School of Music faculty at Florida State University since 1948. He went to New York two weeks ago to record some of his compositions.

A native of Pressburg, Hungary, Mr. Dohnanyi was a pupil of Carl Forster and won acclaim for his genius at the piano as a youth.

He became director of the Budapest Conservatory in 1919 and conducted the Budapest Philharmonic Orchestra. In 1931, he became director of the Hungarian National Radio.
