MUSICAL WIT ON LP—Pianist George Feyer

Some honest entertainment is contained on George Feyer's latest Vox disk, named *Heavenly Echoes of My Fair Lady*. One side is devoted to the pianist's normal cocktail type of skillful tinkling. But on the reverse he plays songs from the show in the style of various composers—Bach, Rachmaninoff, Chopin, Mozart, and several others. Here Feyer displays not only good fingers but a good deal of musical knowledge. It comes as no surprise to learn that he studied with Dohnányi and Kodály in Budapest; only a musician who has the field of piano music at his fingertips could take off the great composers with such wit. It's all clever and a lot of fun.
