

This is to testify that the bearer  
Captain Philip Trgyelmesy  
late of the Hungarian Army,  
native of Pesth (Hungary)  
has served during our war  
of independence 1848-1849 in  
the VI<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Hussars  
wherein he has been gradually  
promoted to the rank of Cap.  
taincy (Chef d'Escadron) having  
been at the later period also  
promoted to the rank of a Ma  
jor, the official nomination  
to that capacity being however  
prevented by the catastrophe  
which brought the struggle to  
an end. Before on the battle  
field, and regular in the duties  
incumbent on an officer of his  
rank and position, he merited the  
satisfaction of his superiors, &  
secured to himself my particular  
and considerate, the more so  
as I had occasion on several  
trying emergencies to be convin  
ced of the trustworthiness, faith  
ful devotion, firmness, and ener  
getic resolution of his charac  
ter. He possesses likewise  
practical acquirements in the  
administrative line of military  
and is extensively acquainted  
with the topographical situation  
and commercial resources of  
European Turkey in general  
and Servia, Bulgaria, Rousia  
Moldo-valachia in particular  
being also familiar with the  
languages spoken in those parts.  
I have great pleasure in adding  
to this certificate, my particular  
recommendation, founded on a  
personal intimate knowledge  
of his services, character and
