Unscheduled Concert

An astonished audience at Kennedy International Airport in New York Wednesday applauded an impromptu concert by Eugene Fodor, the first American to win an award in the coveted Tchaikovsky Violin Competition in Moscow.

As he spoke to newsmen, Fodor took out his violin and began to play as passengers debarked from the Aeroflot jet which had brought them—and him—to New York from the Soviet Union.

No first prize was given in the contest, but three silver medals — second prizes — were awarded to two Soviet musicians and to Fodor, son of a Denver contractor.
