**EMERICH B. FREED, 58,
A. U. S. JUDGE IN OHIO**

CLEVELAND, Dec. 4 (P) — United States District Judge Emerich B. Freed, died today of a heart attack at his home in suburban Cleveland Heights. His age was 58.

A Federal judge since 1941, Mr. Freed was recognized as an authority on anti-trust law. Born in Budapest, Hungary, he came to this country in 1910 with his father, Nicholas, a bookkeeper.

While a student at Western Reserve University, Judge Freed earned his tuition by washing dishes, hustling freight and tutoring students. He received an degree, A. B. cum laude in 1918, and a law degree in 1920.

An assistant county prosecutor in 1928, Judge Freed was an unsuccessful candidate for Municipal Judge three years later. He became Cuyahoga County prosecutor in 1937 and the next year was appointed United States District Attorney.

Judge Freed held that post until his appointment to the then new judgeship for the northern district of Ohio.

In 1930, he married Gertrude Davies of Buffalo.
