

'Battered' Zsa Zsa Is Angry at Spain

LONDON, Nov. 20 (AP)—Actress Zsa Zsa Gabor arrived in London tonight with her wrists and ankles bandaged and claimed she was beaten up by five policemen on a Spanish island.

After a dispute about bills that ended up in court in Palma de Mallorca, Miss Gabor said she'll never go there any more. "I wouldn't spit on Spanish soil."

Airline officials said they had to delay the takeoff of the British European Airways jet for half an hour at Palma before they were able to get Miss Gabor aboard. When she arrived here, she had a dispute with police and customs men at London Airport.

When she got off the plane, she sat down on the aircraft steps. Then she put her arms around a motorcycle policeman who tried to persuade her to board the airport bus. At last an airline car took her to the terminal building. There she was helped up the steps by an airline official and by

her English secretary, Peter Sanders.

Sanders flew with her from Palma and a 21-year-old American model, Mary Michael Patterson.

Customs men at London Airport searched all of Miss Gabor's luggage and found a puppy in a wicker basket.

The dog was taken to the airport animal hospital. Miss Gabor said she would collect it next time she flies to the United States, but she didn't say when that would be. She said she found the dog in a garbage truck in Palma.

Two weeks ago, Miss Gabor was involved in noisy scenes with police at the airport when she tried to bring one of her Yorkshire terriers into the country without leaving it for the mandatory six-month animal quarantine.

When she emerged from customs this time she said: "When we went to leave Palma the other day I was stopped on the plane and my dog was taken away . . . Then the five policemen started beating me up. They

broke my bones. They wouldn't tell me why they did it."

Miss Gabor, who had to remain in Palma because of the dispute over bills, said: "I have paid all the bills. It

cost me \$7,000 and another \$2,000 to get my passport back. They kept me in an ice-cold room for seven hours."

She went off to a London hospital for X-rays.
