Man Indicted in Stabbing Of Woman at Legation

Henry Gartner, 59-year-old Hungarian national charged with stabbing a woman counselor of the Hungarian Legation, was indicted today on charges of assault with a deadly weapon, and house-breaking.

A Federal grand jury returned the true bill before District Court Judge F. Dickinson Letts.

Miss Ida Gyulai, 52, who lives at 2848 McGill terrace N.W., was stabbed twice on January 10 in the Legation chancery, 2118 LeRoy place N.W., according to police.

Gartner reportedly notified an International News Service official here in advance that he was coming to Washington from New York. The wire service had two men accompany Gartner at Union Station and accompany him to the Legation. They were in an anteroom of the Legation when Miss Gyulai was stabbed.

The victim is still recuperating from her wounds. The indictment charges Gartner with the stabbing and with illegal entry of the Legation.

Gartner allegedly held a grudge against Miss Gyulai for delaying papers for his return to Hungary.
