DR. A.L. GABRIEL

Distinguished scholar, lecturer, teacher, author and researcher; director of the Mediaeval Institute at the University of Notre Dame since 1952; corresponding member of the French and Bavarian Academies of Science; honored by the French Government with the Order of the Legion of Honor; decorated by the Republic of Italy for his key role in directing the University of Notre Dame's project of microfilming and photographing the scientific and art treasures of Milan's Ambrosiana Library; at the request of Pope Paul VI, elected the first Honorary Doctor of the Ambrosiana Library; born in Hungary; graduate of the University of Budapest; was the director of the French College in Hungary from 1938-1947; subsequently a member of the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton and Charles Chauncey Stillman Guest Professor at Harvard University; author of numerous books and publications on the history of universities and mediaeval education.
