Dear Mr. Vasvary:

In reply to your letter received July 12, the Tweedy Papers were received many years ago before the Society instituted any detailed inventories or card cataloging of its manuscripts. The article in the Wisconsin Magazine of History did not give the date of the Haraszthy letter, but from the description it seems likely that it may be dated in 1847. At present the Tweedy Papers for the 1840's and 1850's are in use at our Area Research Center in Eau Claire, but they should be returned by the first of October. I will check the box for 1847 for you. Should the letter not be located, any additional searching would have to be done by an outside searcher, whose fee is \$3.00 an hour.

I am sorry that we are unable to answer your request immediately but as soon as the Tweedy collection is returned from Eau Claire, I shall scan the 1847 correspondence for you.
