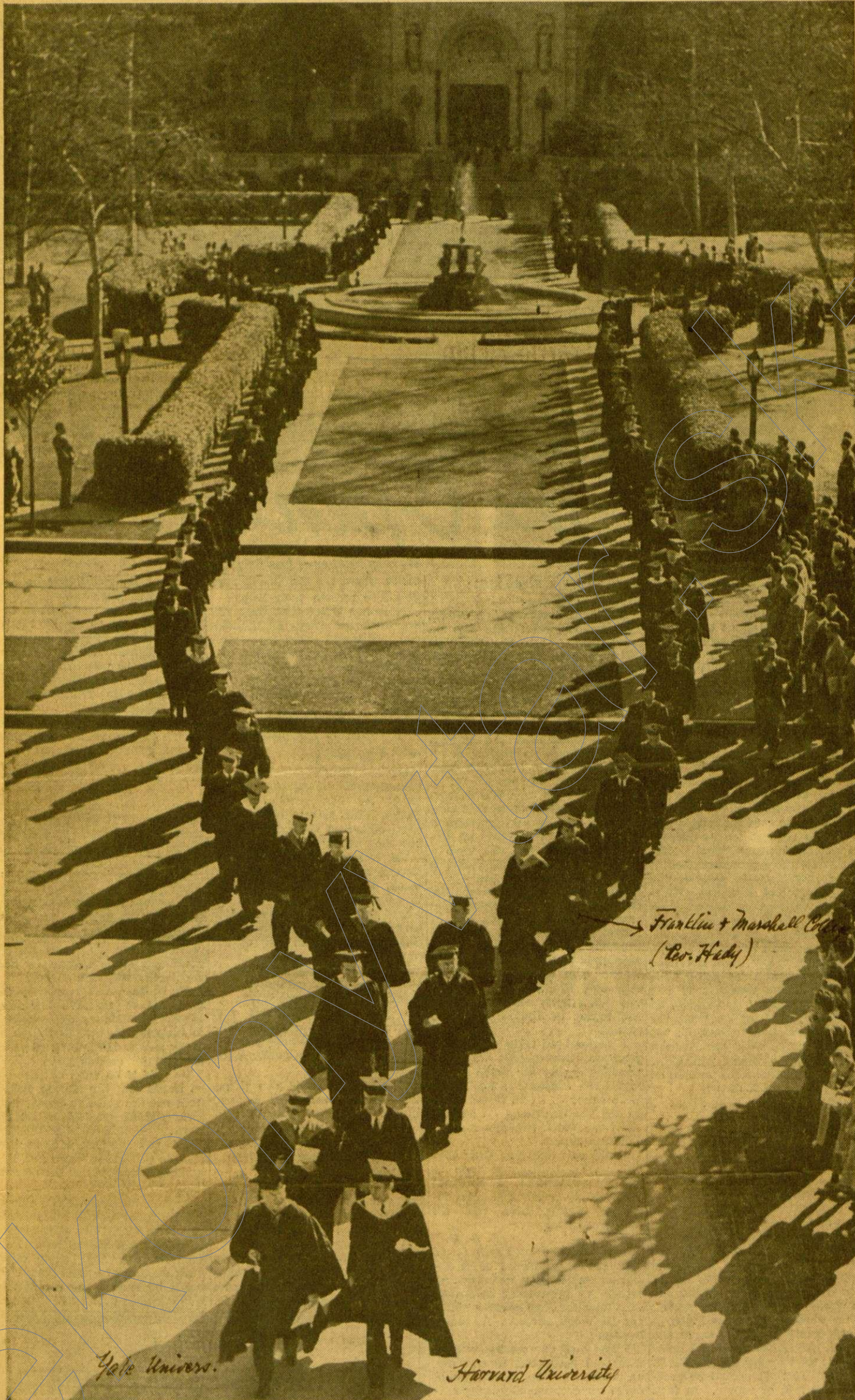
# Gift to Science

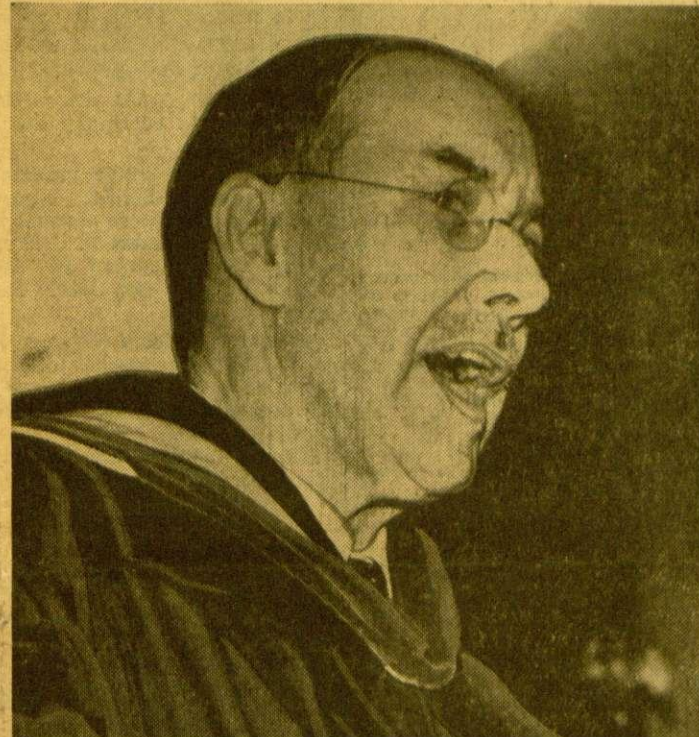

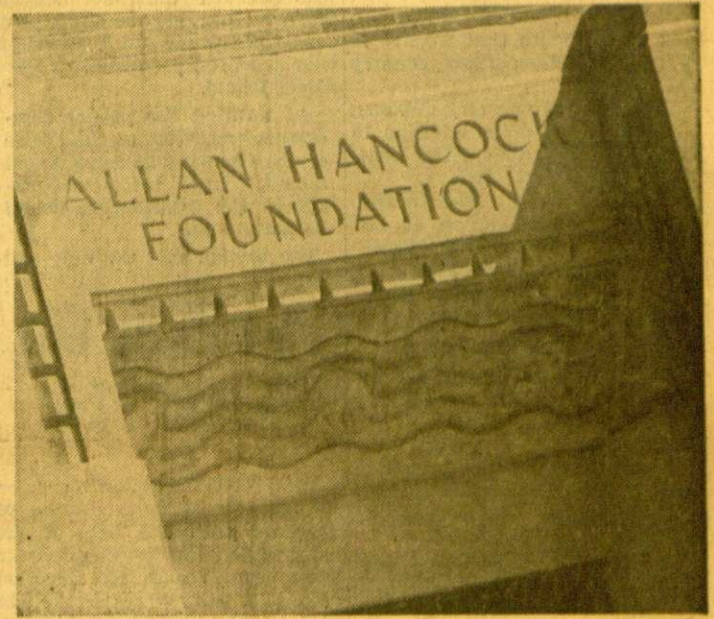

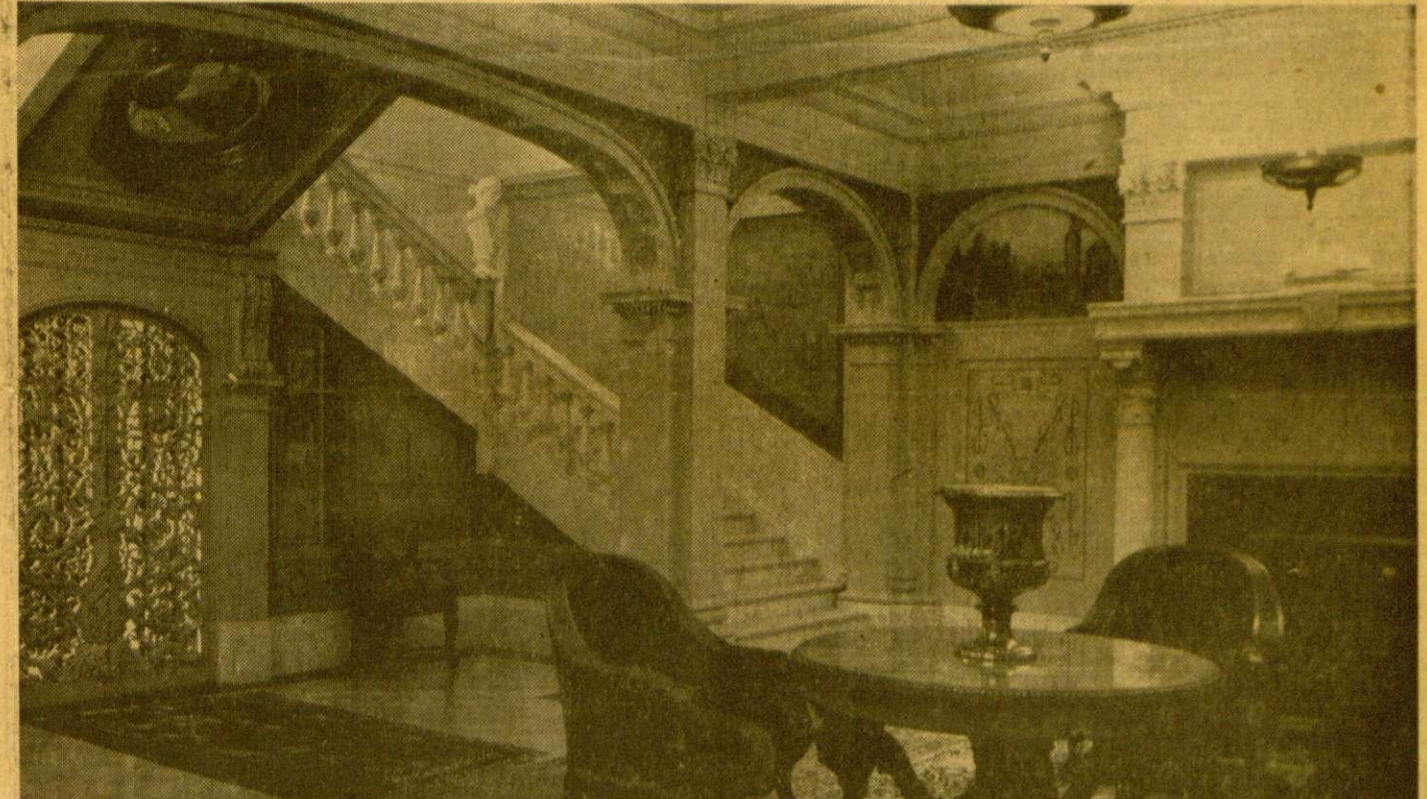
