Count Bela Hadik, 66, a resident of Washington from 1946 to 1948, died Feb. 16 after suffering a heart attack while vacationing in Camden, S.C.

Count Hadik, a native of Budapest, Hungary, was the husband of the former Alice Szechenyi, of Washington, whose father had been an envoy from Hungary to the U.S. from 1921 to 1933.

Count Hadik had been living in Chester, N.H., where he bred Vizsla pointers — a Hungarian dog — at the Futaki kennels.

He was a Knight of the Order of the Golden Fleece, the highest personal award of the House of Hapsburg, and had served in the Hungarian parliament before World War II. He left Hungary in 1945.

Besides his wife, he is survived by two sons, Laszlo, of Washington, and John, of Geneva, Switzerland, and seven grandchildren.
