Yesterday arrived your letter of 2-14-75. I thank you for writing so promptly and I wanted to dash this note off to you for several reasons.

Last Saturday I shovelled snow in the back yard and alley, by our garage, and did it in a hurry so that my back pained to the extent that I did not care to go out to work on my Sunday job at CPS, where I was going to make some additional zerox copies for you...but the weather was bad anyway, and I would have to drive 14 miles to get to that other office. So I stayed home for 3 days and went through a lot of my old correspondence, and copies of newspaper articles on Kossuth, and getting my envelopes ready for OSzK. As an example, I enclose for you Envelope #72 which gives you the contents of that envelope. I started this last year, when I returned from Magyarország and as time allows and I complete a project, with copies, it goes into a special folder and envelope with a summary sheet what is in each. (The enclosed copy from The Cincinnati Gazette for 2-24-1852 is merely marked "65" as that is this numbered page of articles in another envelope for OSzK.) Just thought to show you how occupied I am.

It would be nice if You and I could get to Magyarország and visit the various historical places, take our time, etc., away from this hectic everyday life of ours! I am happy to hear of the 15,000 cards you have accumulated...The Somogyi Konyvtar should make a monument for you and your efforts.
