Mrs. Yturbide was born at and once owned the house at 3425 Prospect ave. nw., one of Georgetown's show places.

Her husband's grandfather. Agustin de Yturbide, over-threw the Spanish colonial government of Mexico and was proclaimed emperor of that country in 1822. Although the rule of this first Agustin ended with his execution and the establishtment of a republic in 1824, the imperial title descended to his grandson.

Mrs. de Yturbide is survived by a sister, Estelle Kearney, of 2700 28th st. nw., and a niece, Mrs. Elizabeth Ann Ward, of Hawaii,

When the Mexican empire was briefly revived in the 1860's by Maximilian, brother of Franz Joseph of Austria, Agustin was adopted by Maximilian as his heir. The victory of the republican forces under Juarez ended the second Mexican empire and Agustin came to the United States, was educated at Georgetown College and later married Miss Kearney.
