arrested 1948, 5 yrs in Comm.  
prisons, incl. RecsK "death camp"

Passed his 1/2 yr exam's at Yale  
(1956) with good success. At Yale he  
shared a room with Ferenc Aladar  
Ógyörgyey, with whom he was  
imprisoned in Hungary, in the worst  
Communist camp at RecsK, for 6  
years - at the beginning of the semester

György did not pass the exam. in French language, bcc. he just started to study it. At the end of the semester, in spite of the fact that he studied day & night, he was very excited, fearing that he will not pass the exam, and thus loses the semester & his scholarship -

Immediately before the exam Jonas paid to him: Don't worry, I'll go in with you, prepare the thesis & hand it in in your place -

The supervising instructor however, knew György & noticed that someone else handed in the thesis.

Before the committee of 3 professors, Jonas explained that for 6 yrs they were such intimate friends and they tried to help each other under any circumstance, when torture & death was lurking around them every minute - that seeing his plight did not weigh his own actions



he saw only that his friend is  
in serious trouble & he must help  
him. Gy. passed all his subjects  
successfully - because of lack of  
time, his preparation in French  
was not satisfactory - and he  
could not bear the thought, that  
on acc't of this, the future of his  
friend will be lost. Only those  
can understand this who - like  
them - spent 6 yrs in the  
death camps of the Communists

The professors were under-  
standing, but because several  
persons knew about the  
incident, they were obliged to  
apply the rules of the University.  
They were apologetic that they  
are obliged to do this. They saw  
to it that he will be admitted  
to Columbia for the next semester  
& he will be reinstated at Yale  
after that, acknowledging the  
semester spent at Columbia
