Kemeny Installed at Dartmouth

HANOVER, N.H. (UPI)—Dr. John G. Kemeny, promising a "new era in higher education," was installed yesterday as the 13th president of Dartmouth College.

Kemeny, 43, a mathematician-philosopher, told 3,200 persons at the ceremonies that one of his first acts would be to knock down the walls preventing effective leadership at the school.

Urging a reorganization of the facility, Kemeny said the four faculties now existing (one for arts and science and one each for the three undergraduate schools) pose "a serious hindrance to the decision-making process. There are too many walls, too many fragments, making it difficult to generate leadership today."

Kemeny succeeded Dr. John Sloan Dickey, who served as president of Dartmouth for 25 years.
