

ZURICH, Switzerland, June 17 (AP)—Zoltan Kemeny, 57, widely known Hungarian-born painter, sculptor and architect, died of cancer in a Zurich hospital Monday

Mr. Kemeny worked as an architect in Paris before the German occupation of France, then moved to Switzerland where he acquired an international reputation as a painter. After World War II he took up metal sculpture. His work was exhibited in several European countries and in the United States, and he was commissioned to design a 120yard long brass panel for the foyer of the new opera house in Frankfurt, Germany. Last year he won the Grand Prix of the Venice Biennale.

He leaves his wife, who is also a painter and sculptor. Both were naturalized as

Swiss citizens.
