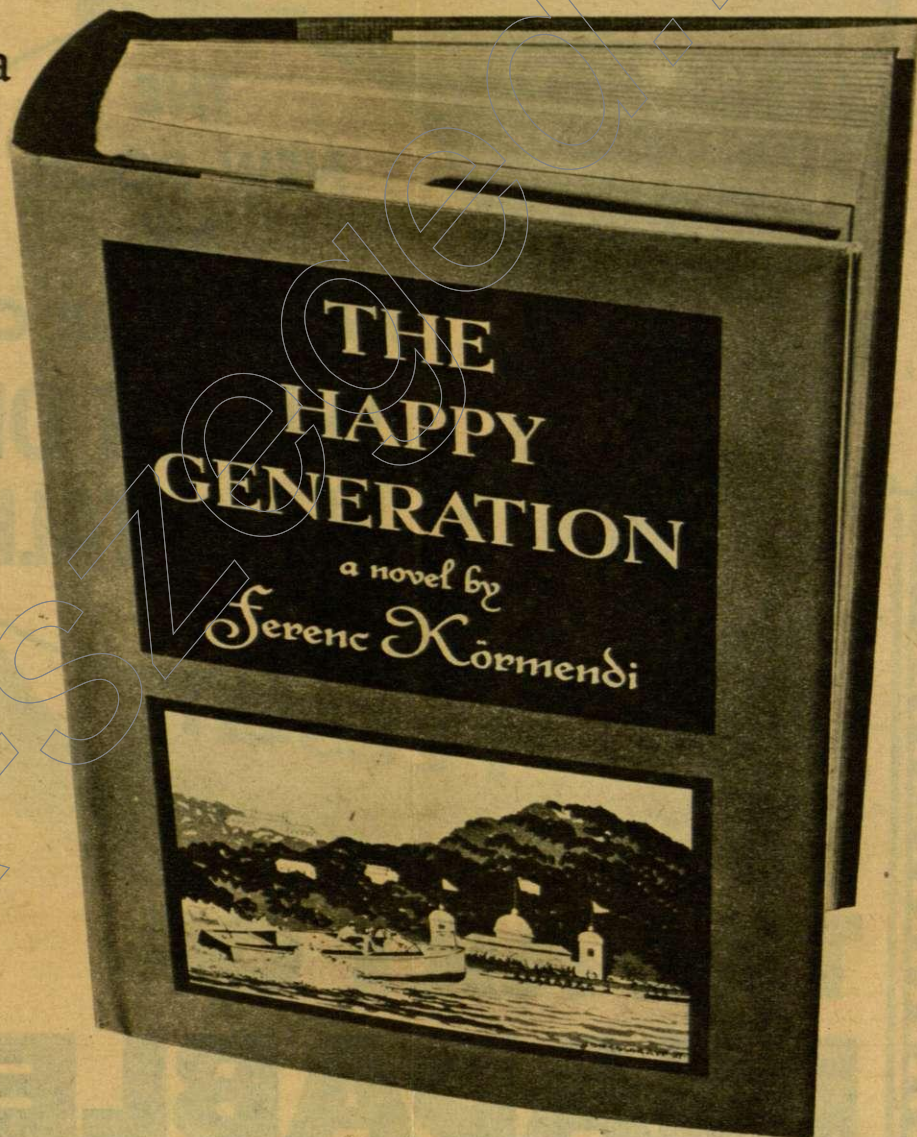


PAUL HEGEDÜS was born with the century in 1900

Dr. Laszlo Hegedüs, but made her conquest of the privileged world in time
to witness its downfall . . . George Hegedüs, who tried in vain to escape
his love for his father's new wife in music and in war . . . Paul himself, who
found peace in his selfless love for a strangely young American woman,
only to lose it by fulfilling that love with her grown-up daughter.
