The author of the article received
the picture from his father, who
at the time was in Smyrna
and found it at the house of a
friend. To his great surprise,
he found the name of his father
(J. Langdon) among the 13 (4 of them Americans)
to whom the picture was
dedicated and who presumably
received a copy of it, who helped
in K's liberation.

The article contains the letter
of J. Langdon, Smyrna, June 23-
1853 to Capt. Ingraham
and his answer, June 24
(To J. Langdon and the
Americans in Smyrna),
and the news item from the
Smyrna French weekly (in
translation); *L'Impartial*,
8th July - 1853.

The author's father sent his
letter from Smyrna
April 13-1911. - (Author was
at this time at Trinity
College, Hartford, Conn.)

Editor's note: as we have been
unable to find a portrait

possible that this is the only one of
him.
