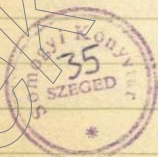

KOSZTA

Ingraham, Duncan Nathaniel
born Charleston S.C., Dec. 6-1802
Served in Mexican war in the
blockading fleet of Vera Cruz. 1850
Commandant of Philadelphia Navy
yard, 1852 Comm. of "St. Louis"
For the Koszta affair infamy
Congress voted him a special
Medal, So. Carolina presented
him with a sword, admirals in
N.Y. gave him a medal. After
return he was for four years
chief of the bureau of
ordnance and hydrography
of the Navy Dept.

When So. Car. seceded,
resigned his commission,
entered naval service of
Confederate States, assigned
to Richmond as chief of
the bureau of ordnance. Later
ordered to Charleston to
command naval forces there.
After civil war he lived in
retirement, died Oct 16-1891
in Charleston, S.C.

His daughter married Wilburn B. Hall,
U.S. Navy
