This is not his real name. Commanded an army corps in the battles against the Germans.

After collapse of Comm., he fled to Austria, where attempts were made to kidnap him to Hungary.

He came to A. with an Austrian passport, made out on some other name, 1923 and settled in Cleveland, where he published a booklet in Hungarian about his activities in H.

In March 1940 he applied for legalization of his stay here. This case was tried in March, 1942, with 72 others.
