Casement went to Paris & there  
married Anne Jephson (Cath.) of  
County Wicklow - Later they returned  
to Antrim - In 1856 C. became  
Capt in North Antrim Militia, but in  
2 yrs resigned -

+ 3 sons; Tom, Charles + Roger, who  
was born Sep 1 - 1864 at Lawson  
Terrace, Sandycove, County Dublin
