Wilson, Rufus Rockwell: Intimate memories

On Pp. 187-88 this amateurishly edited and printed book quotes rearranged extracts from the article of Hamilton Busbey (sic) which originally was published in "The Forum" magazine, March, 1911.

This book spells the name of the author of the quoted article: "Busbey", although it was undoubtedly Bushey, probably the son of T.A. Bushey of South Vienna, Ohio (a very small village between Springfield, O. and Columbus, Ohio) who was the son-in-law of Wm. Turner Coggeshall. *(So Young is on U.S. 40, 11 miles from Springfield, O. towards Columbus)*

The quotation ~~in~~ Wilson's book says:

"When the Hungarian patriot, Kossuth came to the United States he found a responsible soul in William T. Coggeshall (sic) at one time editor of the Ohio State Journal, but who died of fever when U.S. Minister to Ecuador. Mr. Coggeshall toured the country with Kossuth and INTRODUCED HIM in Kentucky to James F. Robinson, a slave holder ... and in Illinois TO ABRAHAM LINCOLN....
