"Major Brown, an Englishman by birth but at present an officer of the Hungarian Army, has recently arrived here as an envoy from the Government of Hungary, and though his acts are closely watched by the Austrian and Russian Legations, his residence appears to be permitted by the Porte. He is intimate at the British Embassy, and I believe is in frequent intercourse with it."
