G. C. Hebbé to Edmund Burke

Washington July 15, 1852

"--- I have had letters from Gen. Kossuth - in which he complains much of the deception which certain persons of the Democ. party have made themselves guilty of in regard to himself - and I have had the utmost difficulty in preventing him from taking steps which would undoubtedly have led to the disorganization and defeat of the Democ. party - I hope that Gen. Pierce's letter to the Democrats of Philadelphia has satisfied Gen. Kossuth at least to some degree - still I know that he expected from Gen. Pierce a still more explicit avowal in regard to the course of foreign policy which this country ought to pursue, but I think the General could not say more in the present state of affairs---
