

## Marx and the peasant

A man, Krieger, emigrated to Amer. + wrote that he was interested in the idea of dividing the agric. land of America into small pieces + giving them to anyone who wanted to become a small farmer

for this heresy, on Marx's insistence he was expelled from party

This proposition - wrote M. - is inconsistent with Communism, for small farmers, too, are property owners. (Mark-Engels Gesamthaft, Ausgabe I. Abteil. Band 6, pp. 8-21)

The division of land among peasants, might perhaps in some countries be considered "initially" (same - Ibid.) an effective Comm. platform - But the ultimate aim of the movement is not to produce small farmers, but, on the contrary, to expropriate those who already exist

This was the first time ~~M~~  
expressed hostility toward  
peasants, which soon  
became burning hatred
