Committed through the Hon A. Lincoln reported  
1849 Sept - Thursday

Resolved, That in their present glorious struggle for liberty, the H's, Command our highest admiration, and have our warmest sympathy.

Res. That they have our most ardent prayers for their speedy triumph and final success

Res., that the Govt of the US should acknowledge the independence of H as a Nation of freemen, at the very earliest moment consistent with our amicable relations with the Govt against which they are contending.

Res. That in the opinion of this meeting, the immediate acknowledgement of the independence of H by our Govt, is due from freemen, to their struggling brethren, to the general cause of Republican liberty, and not a violation of the just rights of any Nation or people.

The resolutions were read  
and adopted by an unanimous  
vote.

on motion of S. Francis, Esq

Resolved, That the Officers of this  
meeting transmit a copy of its  
proceedings signed by themselves  
to Mr Clayton, the Amer. Secy of  
State with a request that  
he will present them to the  
Agent of the Hungarian  
people in the U.S. Court  
W.A.S., that they may have  
placed in the hands of Komth  
the Pres of the H Republic.

The meeting ordered the proceedings  
to be published in the city papers; and
