

Laurens, John 1753-82

Born Charleston, S.C., son of Henry Laurens, later President of the Continental Congress. Washington dictated to him several of his letters.

He was with Pulaski and Kováts at the charge of Charleston, S.C., May 11, 1779, when Kováts was killed.
