Oct 4 Legion enters Trenton N.J.

Oct 5 Evening, Pulaski hears about the plan of Patrick Ferguson's attack, resolves to counteract

Oct 6 Legion starts across the state  
3 companies of light infantry,  
a detachment of light  
artillery, equipped with only  
one brass field piece and  
three troops of light horse.  
Legion encamps near Egg Harbor  
on the farm of James Willets

Oct 13 <sup>Juliat</sup> Gustav Juliat, herzeni  
deszter, hadnagy, hatod  
magával halászni megy.  
Hármat holdszögret itat  
a vígü, Kettöt erőszakal  
Könyörgit, hogy jelt adjanak

Oct. 27 When a member of Congress makes  
traitorous remarks, they send for Palashi

1778 Nov. 6 At the Minisink, on the  
Delaware, Pulaski complains  
to Congress: "nothing  
but bears to fight."  
(Dict. Amer. Biogr. XVI. 259)

The winter of 1778-79 Pultarick spent in the northwestern part of New Jersey, where he guarded the frontiers from the depredations of Indians and Tories. (Bentley)
