Oct 4 Legion enters Trenton N.J.

Oct 5 Evening, Pulaski hears  
about the plan of Patrick  
Ferguson attack, resolves  
to counteract

Oct 6 Legion starts across the state  
3 companies of light infantry,  
a detachment of light  
artillery, equipped with only  
one brass field piece and  
three troops of light horse.  
Legion encamps near Egg Harbor  
on the farm of James Willets

Oct 13 Gustav Juliat  
Juliat, hommá  
deszter, hadnagy, katod

1778 Nov. 6 At the Minisink on the  
Delaware, Pulaski complains  
to Congress: "nothing  
but bears to fight"
