Desire si LIGETI TURCANO AND LIGETI HEARD IN TURANDOT' Two changes in cast featured 1950 last night's performance of Pucci-ni's "Turandot" at the City Center. One involved the role of Timur, which was sung by Desire Ligeti; the other presented Lucia Turcano, in her debut with the company, as Turandot. Miss Turcano, who has sung with the Salmaggi Company in Brook-lyn, and with La Scala of Milan, sang with a hard, brilliant, powerful voice that had more amplitude than color. She was a little unsteady on her initial appearance, though later on she was in better control of both her nerves and her voice. There was something of an edgy quality to her singing at best. Turandot, however, is a cruel role for any soprano, and occasionally Miss Turcano's interpretation suggested that when she feels more relaxed in the opera she will be able to do it greater justice. Physically, she is a stately woman, and she acted in a stately manner. It is doubtful if she ever will win prizes for histrionic subtlety. Desire Ligeti sang the part of Timur resonantly, if not always with absolute control. Others in the cast included Dorothy Mac-Neil, Giulio Gari, Lawrence Win-ters, Luigi Vellucci, Nathaniel Sprinzena, Edwin Dunning and Arthur Newman, Laszlo Halasz con-Cass with Sanfrancisco opera - 1958 Head of Vocal Dept, Denton Miniv.
