L. C. Lucas Died, Age 82 yrs

Was one of few Remaining Survivors
of Hungarian War in 1848

L. C. Lucas, who died Sunday Morning at his late residence, 1809 Oregon Ave, at the age of 82 yrs, was one of the few remaining survivors of the war for Hungarian independence in 1848. With his brother, who was quartermaster general of the Hungarian army, he formed part of the Hungarian army which settled at Davensport, Ia. which a number of leaders in the revolution established at the close of the war. Other survivors still in this city are Judge Rodovich E. Rouband & his brother, Col. Robert J. Rouband.

Mr. Lucas, on coming to this country, Americanized the spelling of his name, the original name being, Lukács, a family of ancient nobility and of prominence in Hungary to the present day. A nephew of the deceased is at this time finance minister of the

nephew, Bela de Lukacs, was for many years minister
of commerce in the Hungarian cabinet and was the
commissioner in charge of the Hungarian exhibit
at the Paris exposition in 1900 and another nephew,
son of his sister, Dezider de Rilaggi, was one of the
two members for Austro-Hungary of the international
court of arbitration at The Hague, having been for
several years speaker of the House of Representatives
and minister of justice.

The deceased served in the Mexican war and
later was ~~the~~ lieutenant of company K, 3rd
Missouri infantry, in the civil war. He was
a member of Frank P. BLAIR post, No. 1, S.A.R.,
which will conduct the funeral on Tuesday. He leaves
a widow and five children - William A.
