Delivered at the dedication of the
renovated church, Aug. 1856.

A temblor held John Herben ding
(Herberdinck) adouanya
temblor 100 lat horn, 70 lat hills
£12,000 or \$60,000 cost

Cornerstone laid July 1 - 1767
by Isaac Roosevelt, elder
of the church, chairman of
Bldg Committee.

Built by the Community of Prot.
Ref. Dutch Church of NY
since familiarly known
as the Collegiate Ref Dutch Churc^y.
New York's population at that
time about 20,000

Dedication of church May 25 - 1769.
Sermon by Archibald Laddie,
who came to Amer. in 1764.
Formerly pastor of Scotch church
at Lushing, Holland. He was
called to be English preacher,
in insistence of young people



in spite of determined
opposition of older people.

In revolut. war, after
British took possession of city,
people dispersed, since almost
all of them were on side of
revolutionists.

The English used the church
for hospital and storage,
lower part stripped of
furniture, walls much
defaced, pulpits taken to
England.

Exile of citizens lasted
seven years. British left N.Y.

Nov. 15 - 1783.

Restoration started at once,
church opened again Dec. 1784.

Restoration again in 1856

Church is built in Roman
style, with a very fine
Corinthian doorway.

The churchbuilding was demolished in 1875 to give place to business buildings
