born 1819 Budapest

educ. in milit schools of Gatz and  
Vienna - became 1st Lt, resigned  
after 12 years in school and service  
in 1845 - next 3 yrs in London and  
Paris - 1848 back to H - Placed

on Gen Armetty's staff as major -  
in several battles, espec. at  
Temeswar - fled to Widdin with  
Armetty, captured by Roum, peasants,  
who shut them in a wooden  
magazine, set fire to it to burn  
them alive, Gen with several  
hundred sold, taking same  
route to Turkey, arrived in time  
to save them, the ship was already in  
Glaucus.

To Sumla<sup>and</sup> Aleppo with Gen  
in Am. New Orleans, end 1851,  
ten days before Kosuth -  
then to St Louis

Lt Col 3rd Mo Inf - 2nd  
Wilson's Creek commanded  
this regt, severely wounded -  
captured by Conf but exch. some days  
later - Recovering, joined  
Freimont, Colonel, with him  
until Fr. resigned in 64 -

Freimont named him Gen but  
since Senate was at odds  
with Fr, was not confirmed

afterwar wealthy bus. man in  
St L, Pres. Metropolitan bank,  
he lost nearly everything

"Amoska" telegraph editor  
over 14 years District Assessor,  
resigned ill health -

left wife & daughter - cremated
