Johnson Aide Leaves for Harvard Job

Francis Bator, a White House foreign affairs aide for three years, has resigned to take a teaching position at Harvard.

Bator, 41, joined the National Security Council staff in 1964 and became deputy special assistant for national security affairs in 1965. His specialty was European affairs and foreign economic policy.

Assuming part of his duties will be Edward R. Fried, a career foreign service officer who now is Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for International Resources and Food Policy. He formerly was a member of the State Department Policy Planning Council.

White House press secretary George E. Christian said Edward Hamilton, now a senior staff member of the NSC, will also take over some of Bator's duties.

Bator will become a professor of political economy at Harvard and a director of studies at the John F. Kennedy School of Government's Institute of Politics.
